Course Purpose and Objectives	<p>The main objectives of the course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> to extend and improve the students' knowledge of French. to introduce new vocabulary and grammar. to be able to speak and read in French at an advanced level. <p>The course is also:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> designed to provide a sequence of experience that enables students to acquire listening and reading skills with an essential recognition of specific vocabulary in order to understand oral and written proposals at any time and of any verb provided. Verbal skills will be acquired through the use of a more or less limited active vocabulary, of a common time, and simpler structures. The writing ability that matches the ability to speak with reasonable accuracy and information for francophone world-people, places, attitudes, customs and geography, will also be practiced.
